The **Global Education Dinner** celebrates the Council's educational programs, which offer students and educators opportunities to engage with foreign policy practitioners and experts and expand their understanding of critical global issues facing the U.S. and the world. Through

study scholarships, teacher development workshops and **Youth Leadership Forums**, the Council is a resource for area educators and students. Last year, the Council held its 15th Annual **Summer Teacher Institute on International Affairs**. Sixty high school teachers joined us from across the U.S. for a week-long program with top foreign policy experts and former U.S. government officials on *Looking Towards Asia*. In early July the Council sent a group of **Young Ambassadors** from DC schools overseas for a three-week intensive language and study program in Costa Rica. The program was done in conjunction with District of Columbia Public Schools and was established to offer opportunities to some of our capital city's neediest students. The Council also regularly participates in the award winning **Academic WorldQuest** competition for high school students, testing students' knowledge of international affairs, geography, history and culture. In 2006, the Washington DC's team took home the national championship!
